
OCTOBER CAMPOUT DINOWORLD

ATTENTION TROOP 1000 ADULTS AND SCOUTS October is Archaeology month and we're going on a Dig!

We'll start our adventure with a trip to Meridian State Park about 2 hours southwest of Plano. There we will set up camp and have a cracker barrel before turning in. The next morning we head up to Dinosaur World in Glen Rose, TX right next to Dinosaur Valley State Park. General Admission rates include access to over 100 life size dinosaurs along with the theme parks exhibits including the areas largest, interactive boneyard, the giant skeletal playground and the Prehistoric museum featuring an impressive collection of everything from trilobites to dinosaur claws and eggs, mammoth bones, and more. Grab some tools and start excavating!



Fossil Dig - The Fossil Dig is a 15-minute guided activity included in every scout's admission. Dig for fossils in a specially stocked pit area that includes everything from shark teeth and gastropods to stingray barbs and Mosasaur teeth. Take home three of your favorites!

Following that will be a visit to Dinosaur Valley State Park. Put your feet in actual dinosaur footprints in the Paluxy riverbed where the first sauropod trackways were discovered.

You can also picnic, hike, splash and fish in the river, watch for wildlife, look for a geocache, or visit the interpretive center. Be glad you did not say: I cannot go!
