Canoeing Campout June 20-22

Hickory Hills Hideaway will be the launching point for this year's Canoeing adventure down a portion of the Neches River, the last wild (but mild) waterway in Texas.

While all the other navigable waterways in Texas have been dammed or otherwise blocked from through passage, the Neches remains open - and it is a wonderful waterway for our Scouts to experience.




The adventure begins **Saturday, June 7th, at the Plano Aquatics Center, 2301 Westside Dr. Plano, TX, from 1:30 pm till 2:30 PM when the Troop will be testing Scouts Swimming ability.** Please come prepared to swim and bring a towel and \$3 entrance fee (or Plano Parks member card).

The 100 yard, multi-stroke swim test is required before a Scout is allowed to participate in aquatics activities with the troop (it is also a 1st Class requirement). Although a make up day will be announced soon, we urge Scouting families to try to make it to this test. Scouts will be categorized as Swimmer, Beginner or Non-swimmer, however all tested Scouts will be able to participate in the Canoeing Campout. Scouts going to Summer Camp will be re-tested for swimming ability in the lake at camp.

In addition to our paddling project, the troop will have an opportunity for a few folks stay on land (by choice) and participate in a service project at the campsite and/or learn how to make Sarsaparilla (a type of Root Beer) from wild Sarsaparilla roots and stems.

IMPORTANT: All Canoe Campout participants must bring a bailing bucket, pail or plastic milk carton with the top cut off as in photo. (we use the part WITH the handle—Remember to keep (and secure) the cap!).



Be sure to tie a rope on the bucket and include a carabineer to secure it to the Canoe.
