



Troop 1000 Backpacking List

Backpack essentials:

- 70L+ Internal frame backpack w/ padded hip belt
- 20L Collapsible Day Pack - for side treks
- Waterproof pack cover
- Mess Kit with lid - Sterilite or Rubbermaid
- Silicone collapsible cup
- Spork - cup & spork should fit in mess kit
- 20° or warmer Mummy Sleeping Bag in stuff sack - should fit in lower compartment
- Sleeping Pad - recommend Klymit Static-V
- Camp Pillow - inflatable or packable
- Roll-top Dry Sacks for organization
- 6 Gallon sized ziploc bags
- 2 large garbage bags
- Tent - from Troop quartermaster

Personal essentials:

- 2 1-liter Nalgene Water Bottles - Filled
- BSA First Aid Kit - available at Scout Shop
- Headlamp - LED style
- Survival Whistle
- Compass
- Fire starting kit
- 2 Bandannas
- Watch
- Pocket Knife or Multi-Tool
- Sunscreen - travel size
- Insect Repellent - travel size
- Repel brand or picaridin. NO DEET.
- Work Gloves
- 50' of Paracord
- Rain Suit (NO FROGG TOGGS)
- Scout Handbook (2019 edition)
- Small towel
- Camp Chair - tripod stool or butterfly
- Sunglasses
- Extra batteries
- Sewing kit
- TP and small trowel or snow stake
- Personal DOPP Kit

Consider combining many of the smaller items into a dry sack or even a 32oz peanut butter jar.
All gear must fit into the backpack.
Hiking poles are recommended.
Hiking poles lash outside pack.

Clothing essentials:

- Field Uniform for travel to and from camp
- Hiking boots - broken in
- Light camp shoes - No open toe shoes
- Extra hiking pants or shorts
- Extra Troop/polypro t-shirts
- Extra pair underwear
- 2 pair thick woolen socks
- 3 pair poly-pro liner socks
- Sleep wear

Cold Weather Clothing as needed

- Long sleeve shirt
- Fleece or Down puffy jacket
- Sweatshirt or sweater
- Long bottom base layer
- Long sleeve top base layer
- Gloves
- Woolen cap
- Extra thick woolen socks
- Hot Hands
- Fleece sleeping bag liner

Crew Gear

- 2 backpacking stoves (1 Apex II)
- Spare fuel as need
- 1-2 pots
- 1-2 spoons
- 1 pot tongs
- Chuck box glove
- Foil for wind screen and pot tops
- Patrol first aid kit
- Tarp with rope, poles and stakes
(Philmont rig)
- Camp shovel
- 1 Polar Pure iodine bottle
- Water filtration system
- Food

The above includes what you wear on the trail.
Trail clothing - COTTON KILLS. NO JEANS.
All clothing should be marked with Scout's name.
Bring a spare set of clothing for long-distance travel.
Adjustments to this list will be approved by the Scoutmaster.
