**Duties:**

- Set Up & Fireman – set up stove; get fire or coals started, ensure fire safety, get water; clean up or organize table for food preparation.
- Cooking – responsible for meal preparation (cutting, chopping, cooking); starts boiling water for clean up.
- Clean Up/KP – Washing, rinsing, drying, and put away in Patrol Box pots pans utensils etc.; Wipe down table, pick up trash, repack condiments etc.; Police site for general camp cleanliness. (*Each scout is responsible for cleaning his own mess kit*)
- Take home Patrol Box after the trip to scrub clean contents, take inventory and report in writing to the Quartermaster (by following Wednesday) low quantities, damaged or missing items. Hold until next trip to rotate to other scout. The Quartermaster will issue supplies, repaired or replacement patrol box equipment prior to the following campout.
